Your impact

Since the launch of the 1990 Club in September 2020, regular giving has increased by 27%, which means we can help more of our students who are most in need – and enhance the College's environment for the benefit of our community and the planet.

It's thanks to your support that over the past 12 months we've been able to supplement the student hardship fund – and complete our drive in replacing every light bulb across the College with environmentally friendly LED bulbs.



Senior Tutor, Dr Yasmin Kahn, shares the impact your support has had on the student hardship fund: "We recognise that sometimes financial situations change for our students due to unforeseen circumstances. College hardship funding for financial emergencies after the start of a course can be a very important intervention.

"Amounts range from £300 to £1,000 and we aim to be responsive – the forms are not lengthy and there is light administration – which means that money can be granted fairly quickly; this year, with the added complications of Covid, an increased number of students have faced unexpected costs or suffered a loss of income.

"As a College, we aren't able to support major shortfalls or to make up the cost of University fees, but often a small intervention can make a big difference and help a student complete their studies successfully, alleviating



financial anxiety. Among other things, this year the hardship fund has been used to cover the unexpected cost of a flight to visit sick relatives, to replace a broken laptop when there were no funds available to supply a new one, and cover the cost of food and short term accommodation while a student was waiting for new housing.

Dr Sandie Byrne is our Sustainability Fellow and Chair of Kellogg's Sustainability Committee: "Donors to Kellogg are enabling our College to lead the way in environmental sustainability. Our second Gold in the Green Impact awards acknowledges our efforts to reduce consumption and waste, and to use environmentally sensitive materials.

"Your help in replacing less environmentally sensitive lighting with LED bulbs throughout College buildings has made a significant impact to our environmental goals. We're also looking at phasing-out bleached white napkins in favour of unbleached and recycled ones, and offering more sustainable menus than ever in the dining hall, including a vegan option at each meal.

"During the summer, Kellogg took part in the University's biodiversity survey and purchased a fixed pump to further encourage students and staff to cycle to College. We have developed a sustainability policy that will enable us to work towards lowering our carbon footprint and to be mindful of the environment in all our endeavours. Our strategy includes appointing a number of student sustainability ambassadors to help us with this.

"Sustainable materials and equipment may require a larger initial outlay than more damaging kinds, but this is an expense that is repaid in protecting our environment, and often in long-term costs.

"We are extremely grateful to those whose generosity makes it possible for our actions not to cost the Earth."
