REPRESENTATION

ORGANISING EVENTS AND SEMINARS

Kellogg is keen to support events organised by Fellows that benefit College members and students, or are public and open to all. The college can help organise and publicise these events. If you would like to plan an event, please use this form to help with the planning, preferably at least four weeks ahead of the date, following up with an email to <u>events@kellogg.ox.ac.uk</u> as needed. Booking a room for a meeting with other Kellogg colleagues, students and advisees is always free. Bookings for events unrelated to Kellogg (eg for a departmental or research group meetings) is normally subject to a booking charge.



Seminars are often held from 5.30-6.30, as the College Hub and other rooms are often available at this time, and it is possible to go to College Dinner afterwards. Organising an event before Guest night dinners helps attract a larger audience. A Fellows' work room, and linked meeting room, is available at No 66. There is also a small kitchen with a fridge, kettle and microwave. Please note that the property does not have an alcohol license. Access to the building and internal rooms is via your University Card. The meeting room needs to be booked in advance via events@kellogg.ox.ac.uk. The other rooms are drop-in, no booking required.
