Your impact

Last year marked another period of growth for regular giving at Kellogg. **We saw a 14% increase in the number of donors who have committed to making regular contributions through the 1990 Club.** In addition, many long-standing members of the 1990 Club increased the value of their gifts to the College. **As a result of the continued expansion of regular giving, philanthropic support from regular gifts rose by 19% last year.**

Your gifts have not only supported our outstanding graduate students through bursaries, travel grants and research funding, but have also enabled us to strengthen our student community and invigorate key aspects of College life. For example, we have expanded our provision of online and in-person community events during Welcome and Welfare Weeks to accommodate our growing body of full-time and part-time students.

Regular Giving through the 1990 Club plays a pivotal role in enabling our students to undertake advanced research at the University and to emerge as leaders in their respective fields. This year, thanks to your support, our students travelled to China, Ghana, and Turkey to present original research at conferences and to conduct archival research. We are immensely proud of our students and alumni who are making substantial contributions to societies and economies worldwide, exemplifying the far-reaching impact of Kellogg as a dynamic and thriving global community.

Bursaries

Students should not be held back by personal circumstances or unexpected economic challenges. At Kellogg, we are committed to alleviating any financial challenges our students may encounter during their studies at Oxford. **Last year, Kellogg awarded bursaries to 90% of applicants, with an average disbursement of £724, compared with an average of £684 the previous year.**





Travel and Research Grants

A world-class Oxford education should offer every opportunity for students to develop their academic excellence. Through our travel and research grants, we empower students to travel to key locations to collect primary data for original research, as well as to present their work at global conferences. **Thanks to regular giving, we awarded 183 travel and research grants, compared with 100 in the previous year, an increase of 83% in the number of students receiving grants.**

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As a Fine Art student at Oxford, participating in international exhibitions is crucial to advancing my career as an artist. I was honoured to be selected as one of the Arte Laguna Prize Finalist Artists. My work, *Suffering*, a large inflatable sculpture of lungs standing 3.5 metres tall, represented the sculpture category in the exhibition.

For the Arte Laguna Prize Finalists' exhibition, I shipped my artwork from Oxford to Venice, Italy, and hired a professional photographer on site to document the work. During term time, I travelled to Venice to attend the exhibition's opening night and the artists' talks. The research grant provided essential financial support, enabling me to successfully complete this project, an invaluable opportunity for an emerging artist.

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The opportunity to present at the HEC Liège Young Researchers Conference in Economics (HYRCE) in Liège, Belgium, has had a significant impact on my studies and academic development. As a DPhil candidate in Sustainable Urban Development, my research often engages with complex, systemic issues such as energy poverty and energy transitions. Presenting on electricity access and renewable energy potential in Sub-Saharan Africa allowed me to step beyond my immediate research focus and apply my knowledge in a broader global context.

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The Kellogg bursary enabled me to attend high-level seminars and meetings at the World Health Organization (WHO) and other United Nations and global health agencies in Switzerland, where I learned about research–policy translation, global health priorities, and early career pathways, while also benefiting from valuable networking opportunities.

This experience directly supported the development of my doctoral research and my broader professional trajectory. It also enabled me to represent my home country, Bangladesh, the Nuffield Department of Population Health, Kellogg College, and the Oxford Global Health Society on a global platform.




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I presented the findings of “Interventions to enable or improve evidence-informed decision-making (EIDM) in public health and preventive medicine practice” at the Pandemic Evidence Collaboration 2025 Conference in Banff, Canada. It was both personally and professionally gratifying to learn about the work being undertaken around the world to strengthen the evidence base for pandemic response. As a public health physician practising during the pandemic, I often had to rely on evidence derived from other infectious diseases, single case studies, or modelling to inform my decisions. I am hopeful that this collaboration, both the relationships formed, and the research strategies developed, will better prepare us for future public health emergencies.

Enhanced Student Experience

Last year, we continued to enhance the Kellogg student experience by organising more in-person and virtual Welcome Week events, renovating the Common Room, and adding new student bedrooms to one of the Kellogg villas.

We installed 66 photovoltaic panels on the Balfour Dining Hall as part of our drive to decarbonise the College estate. Generating around 27,000 kWh of clean energy each year, these will reduce our reliance on the electricity grid. In addition, we provided new lockers for College members, offering more space for backpacks and personal belongings, and upgraded the current on-site cycle parking facilities.

At Kellogg, we are dedicated to ensuring an enriching and positive College and Oxford experience for all our students. These initiatives are made possible through your generous regular giving. Thank you for your continued support.
